You must submit a **signed and notarized** application to the Administrative Office of the District Courts located at 1201 Franklin, 7th Floor, **by 5:00 p.m. on April 27th, 2007.**

Late applications will not be accepted.

Exam scheduled for the week of 5/7-10/2007 from 1p-4p each day at 1201 Franklin 7th Floor. Please sign up for the first available date AFTER you return the application packet. A Study Guide is included with this application.

Required Application Attachments

1. A recent electronic photograph (jpeg format) of yourself, If you do not have an electronic photo, make arrangements with the Administrative Office of the District Courts to have one taken. Photos will be taken every Monday and Wednesday between 1p and 2p until April 27, 2007. No hard copy photos will be accepted.
2. Your **most recent** annual CLE report from the State Bar.
3. An electronic copy of an appellate brief or a post-conviction writ you authored and filed. (Only required if applying for appellate appointments.) Hard copies will not be accepted.
4. Any other documents specified in the application. Please also include written explanations if you have ever:
 - a. been sanctioned by the State Bar Grievance Committee.
 - b. been sanctioned for failure to appear before a court.
 - c. admitted, in connection with an official proceeding, to having provided ineffective assistance of counsel.
 - d. been convicted or placed on deferred adjudication for any offense other than traffic offenses.

INCOMPLETE APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED.

NON-CAPITAL CERTIFICATION EXAM STUDY GUIDE

The exam is open book and given online. You will have 3 hrs to complete the exam.

It may cover significant, non-capital, criminal cases from the US Supreme Court and Texas Court of Criminal Appeals and provisions of the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure, the Texas Penal Code, and the Texas Rules of Evidence. Specific examples of topics that the exam may cover are listed below:
