

Under the current Thirty-Sixth Emergency Order Regarding the COVID-19 State of Disaster (Misc. Docket No., 21-9026) and Executive Order GA34, in-person proceedings may resume.

What does the bar need to know about the family law division?

- 1) All docket calls will remain virtual until further notice. Not all courts hold docket calls, but those that do with continue to hold their docket calls virtually.
- 2) <u>In-person proceedings in the family courts will be set one at a time</u> as preferential settings and as scheduled by the individual courts. <u>Not all courts will begin holding in-person hearings</u> immediately. The decision of when to begin is up to each individual court. <u>Please check with your specific court to determine if in-person hearings are being held.</u>
- 3) <u>Prior to</u> the <u>scheduling</u> of an in-person proceeding, <u>attorneys</u> and <u>pro se parties must provide</u> the court coordinator <u>the number of individuals</u>, <u>including support staff</u>, they desire to <u>bring in-person</u>. The court will review the request and coordinate with the other courts on the same floor. In addition, <u>courts may request information concerning exposure to or symptoms of COVID-19</u>, as required under the Thirty-Sixth Emergency Order Regarding the COVID-19 State of Disaster.
- 4) Each court will ensure compliance with the capacity limits set by the fire marshal and the COVID-19 Operating Plan for the Harris County District Courts, County Courts at Law & Probate Courts, implemented May 21, 2020. All courts will continue to comply with the social distancing and safety protocols set out in the COVID-19 Operating Plan for the Harris County District Courts, County Courts at Law & Probate Courts.
- 5) If the in-person proceeding is a jury trial, the court shall comply with the Jury Proceeding Addendum to COVID-19 Operating Plan for the Harris County Judiciary.
